GENERAL INFORMATION

1. **DATE** April 12-14, 2019
2. **LOCATION** Thompson Farm
6110 Circle Rd
Corryton, TN 37721
3. **COST** \$10 per Scout and Leader (Includes program supplies and patch)
4. **CAMPSITE** Units will have a designated area to set up their troops cooking area. Scouts may camp by patrols in the field. Leaders can camp with their troop or close to their cooking area.
5. **VEHICLES** All vehicles beyond the one allowed in the campsite area will be parked in the designated parking area. Vehicles should not be moved until the closing of the event without permission from the camporee director.
6. **UNIFORMS** All Scouts and Scouters should wear their field uniform when traveling to and from the event. Uniform is also to be worn for Flag Raising, Flag Lowering, and Sunday Religious Observance. The activity uniform should be worn on Saturday during the events
7. **LEADERSHIP** According to the new national policy, there must be at least two adults both 21 years or older present at all times during the event. One of the adults must be registered and have completed youth protection.
8. **FACILITIES** There will be restroom facilities available for the event. Units should come prepared with WATER and other unit supplies.
9. **MEALS** Units will be responsible for cooking Friday Supper, Saturday Breakfast, Saturday Lunch, Saturday Supper, and Sunday Breakfast. We will be awarding the golden spoon for the best overall meal. Units will be awarded points for each course presented, i.e. meal and desert.
10. **EVENTS** Competitions are outlined on page 3. We will need 1-2 judges from each troop to oversee activities.
11. **AWARDS** First place awards will be presented for each judged event. Ribbons will be awarded to the top 3 overall in activities. Also, we will award the Spirit Drum, Golden Spoon, and Campsite.
12. **ARRIVAL/SETUP** Units should plan to begin arriving at 5:00PM. Unit Leaders should come prepared with a copy of the unit list and fees.
13. **OVERVIEW** Patrols will be challenged in Fishing events and will be evaluated based on specific standards. There will also be instructional time during the event rotations.
14. **Licensing** All Scouts (13+) and Leaders should purchase a fishing license prior to the event. All participants need to bring a copy of their license. ACTIVITIES:

- Fishing Golf
 - o Patrols will divide into teams of 4 to compete in a team scramble golfing competition with fishing poles. Each team of 4 will have a series of holes to hit with fishing tackle. Patrol members will track the number of casts needed to hit the target and the team with lowest number of casts wins. Patrol members scores will be averaged together for a patrol score.
- Tomahawk
 - o Just for Fun! Patrols will be given time to take turns throwing axes.
- Fishing Knots
 - o Patrols must know basic fishing knots and will compete in a knot tying competition.
 - o There will be an instructional period before the competition.
- Tackle Box
 - o Scouts will be presented objects and must decide what is or is not needed in the box. The patrol with the most correct items wins.
- Longest Cast
 - o Patrols will be given 5 casts to determine the longest cast.
- Cast Accuracy
 - o Patrols will select 3 scouts to cast at various objects. Each object has a different point value. The patrol with the most points wins.
- Fishing Safety and First Aid
 - o Instructional time to discuss safety and first aid, focusing on fishing related topics. Patrols will also practice removing a hook.
- Fishing Competition
 - o Each patrol will be given an allotted time to fish. Points will be given for the Longest, Smallest, and Most Caught.
- TN Fishing Laws
 - o Scouts will be given a list of questions to answer as a group based on TWRA Laws. Most correct answers win.
