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A Little History of FCFY

- Pre-1989, Ranks had a Time Deadline
- FCFY based on Statistics
- Statistics can be misleading
- Couple of Competing Schools of Thought
 - FCFY is "correct and proper" per National
 - Is based on Statistics and no real effective purpose
- Both are Flawed



Flaws

- Timeline based plan ignores the Scout
- Could be retention or bottom line driven
- Might be 15, 18 or 24 months vs. 12 depending on the Scout

But there are some good points



FCFY Benefits – Does it Matter?

- Healthy Troop Indicator
 - Regular Camping
 - Providing Opportunities to learn
 - Delivering on Aims and Methods
 - Promises being delivered
- Scout is Active



Misconceptions

- Not the only indicator
- If scouts not attaining FCFY
 - Scout "ought to" reach goal
 - Troop doing it wrong
 - Sense of Urgency for subsequent ranks, Merit
 Badges or Eagle well before age 18



Going Forward

- Should troop promote FCFY?
 - Yes
- Should Scouts aspire to FCFY?
 - Yes
- Do troops need a plan as a guide?
 - Yes
- Need a specific time driven plan "just because"?

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No, or at least maybe not

Going Forward - Continued

- Do Things that make advancement likely
 - Better PLC's
 - Better Troop Guides, Instructors, New Scout Patrols, etc.
 - Provide opportunities
 - Scouts are having fun (don't underestimate)
 - Engaged in process of running troop (Youth Led)



Going forward – Cont.

- Do's (Continued)
 - Camping monthly
 - Older Boys mentoring, teaching and leading
 - The Patrol Method
 - Benefits both groups
 - Regular Rewards and Recognition
 - Strong Program (Year Round, Every Year)



Bottom Line

- Scouts advance who are:
 - Committed
 - Involved
 - Engaged
- Natural result of the health of the program
- Those who aren't probably won't
