

Order of the Arrow Event Code of Conduct

The general welfare of our group depends on the conduct of each individual; this ensures the success of OA events and provides the maximum benefit to everyone. As an Arrowman, I understand this and support the reasonable demands of conduct expected of me.

As a member of the Order of the Arrow, I will:

1. Observe the Scout Oath, Scout Law, and the Order of the Arrow Obligation.
2. Follow all Youth Protection Rules.
3. Use social media apps appropriately and in accordance with the Scout Oath and Law.
4. Be in full Scout uniform when required. For all meals, training sessions, activities, and events, participants may wear an OA or Scout t-shirt or golf shirt with their Scout shorts or trousers. When not in uniform, attire must still be Scout-appropriate.
5. Attend all planned events and required events.
6. Confine patch trading to free periods and designated areas.
7. Be personally responsible for breakage, damage, or loss of property.
8. Observe quiet hours and lights out. All participants must be in their assigned camping area during this time.
9. Keep my area clean and orderly and dispose of trash in proper receptacles.
10. Not change my assigned camping area without permission from lodge leadership.
11. Allow no unregistered person to be in camp.
12. Wear appropriate attire when going to the bathrooms and around my campsite. I will also wear suitable covering while swimming or participating in any programs.
13. Observe all rules regarding Aquatics areas and facilities when allowed by camp leadership under appropriate NCAP-trained supervision.
14. Refrain from the purchase, possession, or consumption of alcoholic beverages or illicit drugs (which includes all marijuana) at the camp, as they are not permitted and will result in immediate dismissal from the OA event. This standard applies to all youth and adult staff and participants.
15. Comply with federal, state, and city laws, including those that prohibit the use of fireworks, firearms, and gambling. Infractions of these laws and regulations will be cause for immediate dismissal from the event.
16. Not sell items at the event. I understand that the trading post is the only source for the sale/purchase of memorabilia and materials at OA events.
17. Abide by the camp's NO SMOKING policies at all times.

19. At all times, be considerate to other OA members and guests.
